Dr. Robinson engaged the community by answering questions and speaking on the importance of managing Diabetes and High Blood Pressure.

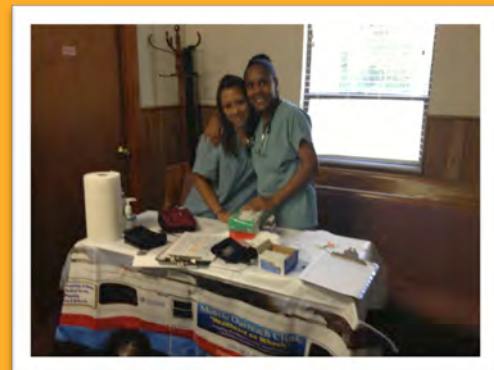
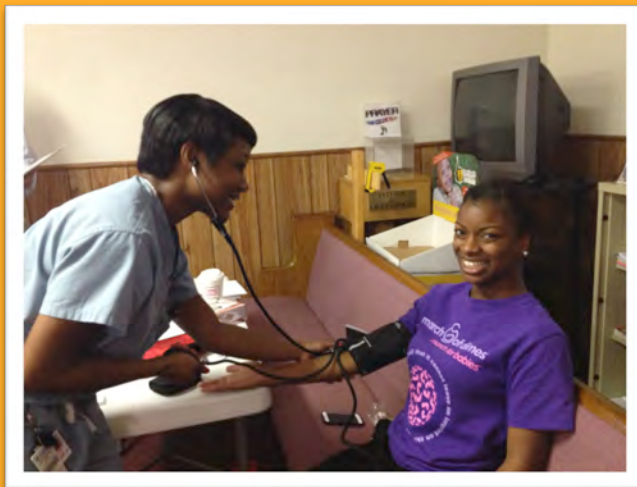
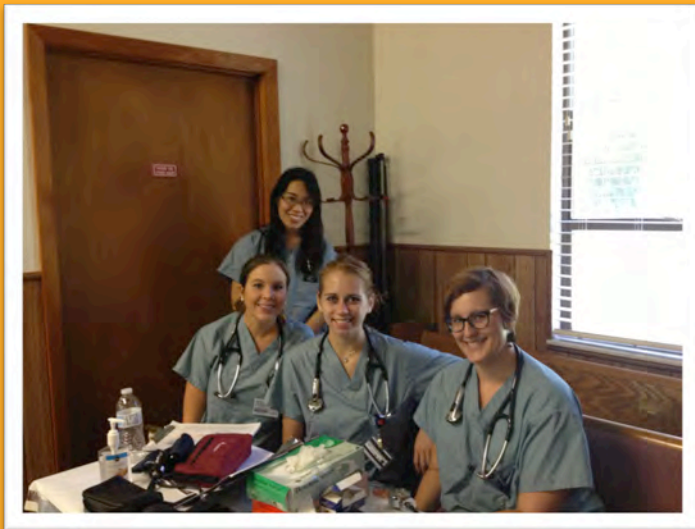
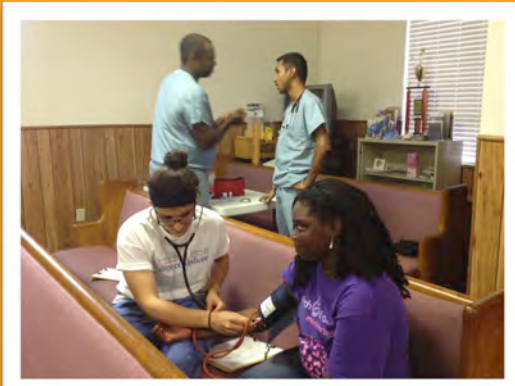

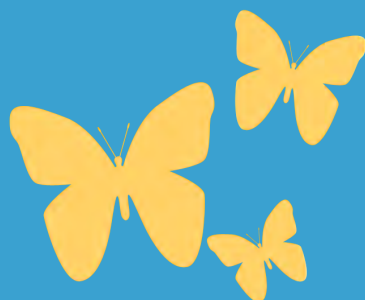
How Can You Help SNMA?
